Lessons Learned About Jesus:

- 1. Jesus is omniscient knowing of the death of a son before it even happened.
- 2. Jesus/God is never late or caught by surprise by our sufferings.
- 3. Jesus may at times permit our suffering to demonstrate His compassion in relieving it.
- 4. Jesus relieves suffering for the greater purpose of demonstrating His deity causing glory to God and worship.

Lesson Applied:

- 1. Jesus is present in the life of the redeemed both individually, and corporately. Therefore, how much greater should our lives respond in reverence, awe, and worship.
- 2. Jesus is aware of our every suffering and affliction and will either deliver us or enable us at the providentially perfect time.
- 3. Jesus resurrected the deceased apart from anybody's faith but based only on His sovereign will.
- 4. Jesus has the power, authority, and compassion to care for His flock.

Remember: Your responsibility, by God's enabling, is to consistently apply the divine principles and truths you have heard (Phil. 2:1-13; 1Tim. 4:7-9; James 1:22-27. As you meditate on this message, ask yourself these questions:

How does God want my beliefs/actions to change? How can I accomplish this change? What is the first step toward bringing about this change?
