IV. The _____ of Sanctification *Preserved Complete 23.*

A. The Elements of Preservation

1. **The Body** is our outward material portion and the instrument through which the inner life expresses itself. This is that portion yet to be glorified.

2. **"The spirit** is the highest and most distinctive part of a man. It is the life principle imparted to man by God who is Spirit, enabling him to know and communicate with God. But with the fall, man as a spiritual being was separated from God and spiritual death resulted. The impartation of a new spiritual nature in the new birth is necessary so that man can again have direct communion with God." D.Edmond Hiebert

3. **"The soul** may be viewed as the self-conscious life of man, the seat of personality. The self-conscious personality reaches out in two directions. In relation to the world, the soul is entirely dependant upon the body for its information and responses. Through his spirit, man reaches up to the spiritual world, Godward." D. Edmond Hiebert
